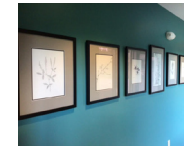

George Landis Arboretum: Who We Are

Established by Fred Lape in 1951, the Landis Arboretum is a private, non-for-profit organization in the scenic and historic Schoharie Valley. Our several hundred acres are dedicated to preserving and protecting our heritage of natural and cultivated plantings. Visitors can explore 8 miles of trails, our historic collections of specimen plantings, old growth forests, managed woodlots, and our Native Plant Trail. Our educational programs foster an appreciation of the environment and appeal to all ages. Landis has also had a long tradition as a center for the arts. We are open to the public from dawn to dusk, 365 days a year.

At the Landis Arboretum, we are investing in the future.

We supported the arts: the opening of Anne Jaster Gallery at the Meeting House Complex . . . continued popularity of our Full Moon Concert Series . . . drumming at the Meditation Garden for all to enjoy . . .

We offered education: a full program of nature education classes and workshops . . . family-friendly programs for all ages . . .

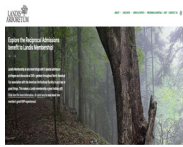
